CENTRAL SECTOR

Central Sector officers are continuing to work hard at tackling the issues in your community. The Christmas and New Year Period was busy, but we were able to put out extra targeted patrols which meant that offences of disorder and anti social behaviour were kept to a minimum. Events and good work that have been happening in on your Sector include:

- Robert Le King School. Kingshill NPT officers, PC Phil May and PCSO's Liz Kilgour and Nis Sultan carried out fantastic work building up intelligence and investigating an offence of burglary. As a result, the property was recovered and two people have been arrested and charged, one with burglary and one with handling.
- As some of you may be aware, the Operation Dakota trial is currently going on in Bristol. This relates to an attack on a pupil at Ridgeway School. Some areas of Central Sector have been affected by this trial and as a result we have several patrol strategies in place, providing a visible presence for the community.
- Broadgreen NPT is continuing to work hard on its policing priorities. Officers have been patrolling the area and within the last month, several girls working in Manchester Road as prostitutes have been dealt with, including three arrests. Police have also made arrests in relation to those kerb crawling
- Old Town NPT were able to collate evidence regarding a brothel on their area. This lead to the execution of a warrant which resulted in the arrest of one person on suspicion of keeping a brothel.

Forthcoming events include a week of proactive activity in March, and a joint initiative with Trading Standards. Other events include:

PCSOs Tony Sole and Olly Bent (Old Town) are aiming to carry out their cycling proficiency course, to enable them to carry out this training themselves.
